

From January 2023 - December 2023

FoC served 235 requests with \$114,828.84 in supports with 42% towards travel, 41% in accommodation, 13% in food and the rest in supplies and therapies. We are up by 20% overall in the travel and accommodation categories, food supports are a 5% increase and a 20% decrease in other supports from 2022.








Total disbursements for 2023: Count By Community

Recent issues in 2023 that will carry over into 2024:

Recently, Alberta Health Services issued a directive requiring out-ofprovince patients to be referred to their home province for medical care.





This directive will have a significant and detrimental impact on our community. East Kootenay residents have long relied on accessing medical care in Calgary, which is significantly easier to access compared to other options.

However, with this directive in place, the only alternative would be to travel to Vancouver or Kelowna, which are considerably farther away and pose substantial challenges for many individuals and families.
